#### **QUOTA EXCHANGE**

The market-clearing price established for the June, 2011 Quota Exchange was **\$29,200.00**.

The next Quota Exchange will be held on July 15, 2011. All offers to sell and bids to purchase quota through the Quota Exchange must be received at the SaskMilk office by midnight, July 6, 2011. SaskMilk recommends that offers and bids be submitted well in advance of the deadline date to ensure adequate time for corrections, if necessary.

Just a reminder to producers that when making bids on the Quota Exchange, the price on offers to sell quota is the minimum price that the producer is prepared to accept for that quota. Only if the market-clearing price is equal to or greater than the producer's minimum price will that producer qualify for participation in the Exchange. Conversely, the price on offers to purchase quota is the maximum price that the producer is prepared to pay for that quota. Only if the market-clearing price is equal to or less than the producer's maximum price will that producer qualify for participation in the Exchange. The clearing price is set at the price where the smallest difference exists between the accumulated volume offered for sale and the accumulated volume bid to purchase.

The results of the Quota Exchange are outlined in the following Table.



#### FORM DEADLINES TO BE STRICTLY ENFORCED

Producers, please be reminded of the following deadlines for submitting forms to the Board office. All forms must be 100% complete to be considered. <u>These deadlines will be strictly enforced by the</u> **Board, no exceptions.** 

When mailing, faxing or emailing forms to the Board, producers should call the Board office to ensure that their forms have been received prior to the deadline.

**1.** Private Quota Transfers – forms due by 11:59p.m. on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of each month for an effective date of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of the following month. This deadline also applies to farm name changes and moving to new production facilities.

2. Quota Exchange Bids – forms due by 11:59p.m. on the  $6^{th}$  day of each month for an effective date of the  $1^{st}$  day of the following month

3. Transfer Credits – forms due by 11:59p.m. on the  $20^{th}$  day of each month for an effective date of the  $1^{st}$  day of the same month

**4.** Banking Information Changes – **Producers changing bank account information must notify the Board of this change at least 7 days prior to the next producer payment date.** 

In May, Saskatchewan had a monthly CDC allocation of **750,922 kilograms** of butterfat. In the month of May, Saskatchewan production was **-259 kilograms** of butterfat **under** and cumulatively **under** by **-168,213 kilograms** of butterfat. On a percentage basis, Saskatchewan is at **-1.91%** within our CDC allocation flexibility limits based on the Continuous Quota model. The -1.50% lower limit is in effect.

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### What is the maximum amount of transfer credits that I can transfer out in a month?

The maximum transfer credits a producer can transfer out in a month are equal to what the producer's cumulative under position was in the previous month. You can only transfer out to a cumulative position of zero credits.

What is the maximum amount of transfer credits that I can transfer in?

There is no limit to the amount of credits that can be transferred in within a rolling 12 month period. The only limit when transferring in credits would be to not drop below the -30 credit day limit (-20 credit days effective the end of November) at the end of each month or you will have lost the opportunity to carry-forward those credits to produce that milk in the future.
