### **QUOTA EXCHANGE**

The market-clearing price established for the September, 2011 Quota Exchange was **\$28,725.00**.

The next Quota Exchange will be held on October 17, 2011. All offers to sell and bids to purchase quota through the Quota Exchange must be received at the SaskMilk office by midnight, October 6, 2011. SaskMilk recommends that offers and bids be submitted well in advance of the deadline date to ensure adequate time for corrections, if necessary.

Just a reminder to producers that when making bids on the Quota Exchange, the price on offers to sell quota is the minimum price that the producer is prepared to accept for that quota. Only if the market-clearing price is equal to or greater than the producer's minimum price will that producer qualify for participation in the Exchange. Conversely, the price on offers to purchase quota is the maximum price that the producer is prepared to pay for that quota. Only if the market-clearing price is equal to or less than the producer's maximum price will that producer qualify for participation in the Exchange. The clearing price is set at the price where the smallest difference exists between the accumulated volume offered for sale and the accumulated volume bid to purchase.

The results of the Quota Exchange are outlined in the following Table.

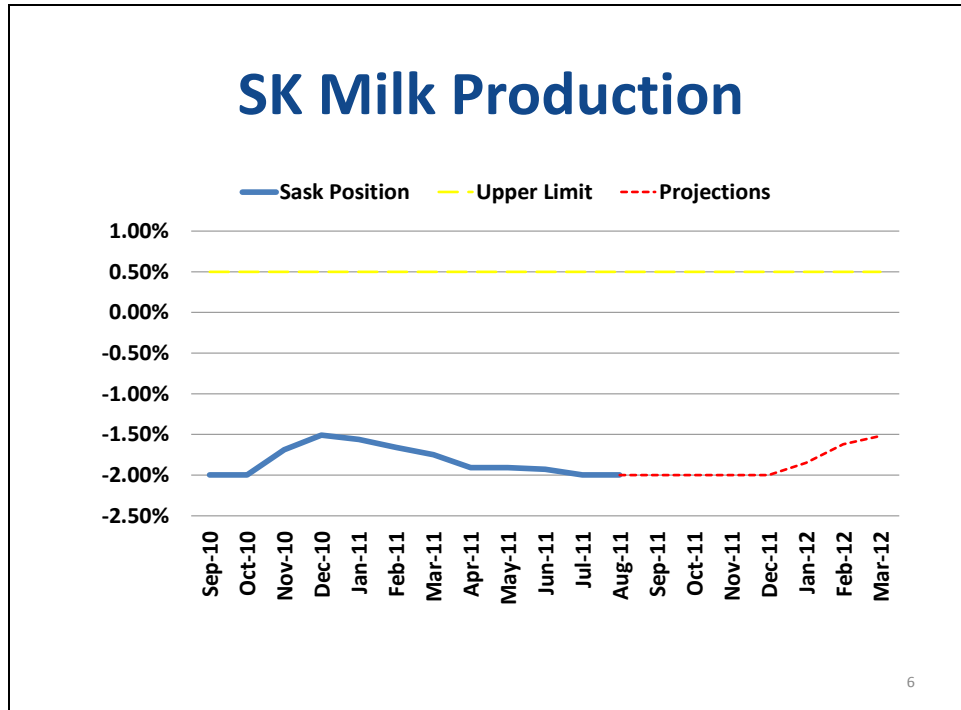

### **FORM DEADLINES TO BE STRICTLY ENFORCED**

Producers, please be reminded of the following deadlines for submitting forms to the Board office. All forms must be 100% complete to be considered. **These deadlines will be strictly enforced by the Board, no exceptions.**

When mailing, faxing or emailing forms to the Board, producers should call the Board office to ensure that their forms have been received prior to the deadline.

- 1. Private Quota Transfers – forms due by 11:59p.m. on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of each month for an effective date of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of the following month. This deadline also applies to farm name changes and moving to new production facilities.**
- 2. Quota Exchange Bids – forms due by 11:59p.m. on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of each month for an effective date of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of the following month**
- 3. Transfer Credits – forms due by 11:59p.m. on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of each month for an effective date of the 1<sup>st</sup> day of the same month**
- 4. Banking Information Changes – Producers changing bank account information must notify the Board of this change at least 7 days prior to the next producer payment date.**

In August, Saskatchewan had a monthly CDC allocation of 746,320 **kilograms** of butterfat. In the month of August, Saskatchewan production was **-13,118 kilograms** of butterfat **under** and cumulatively **under** by **-178,364 kilograms** of butterfat. On a percentage basis, Saskatchewan is at **-2.00%** within our CDC allocation flexibility limits based on the Continuous Quota model. The -1.50% lower limit is in effect.

## **GST ON HAULAGE**

GST will now be charged at the producer level on haulage.

Prior to receiving our ruling on GST charged at the producer level, SaskMilk remitted the GST on producers' behalf. To ensure compliance with Federal Tax Legislation, SaskMilk requested a ruling from Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) as to whether GST was to be applied at the producer level.

“It is CRA position that, as that SaskMilk is transporting milk on behalf of producers, the producers have title to the milk at the time of transportation. Accordingly, the basic, provincial and extra freight haulage deductions made by SaskMilk are service charges for the supply of a service of transporting the producers' milk. As such the haulage fees are consideration for a taxable supply and subject to GST/HST.”

Producers will be able to recoup the GST when they file their GST remittances.

I had my first work-experience in England on a animal-shelter called *Woodgreen*, I enjoyed my time there working with the cats and dogs and horses.

**The year 2009** I travelled to New Zealand and I arrived the 14 of July, and I was working on a dairy farm for 10 month time. It was a really experience rich trip and it gave me a lot of baggage to bring home.

**The farm** is in Canterbury, it's called *Holland's farm* and the owner is John Gray. Of cause while I was there, I travelled around a lot, and I have seen most of the south Island.

**My education** is for being an animal keeper. The education is alternately school and "practice" (work experience). In the last 3-4 years I have had work experience in **Denmark, England and New Zealand**.
