Producer applicants must be:

- Saskatchewan producers 18 years of age
- Demonstrate a minimum of \$50,000 gross farm income in Saskatchewan
- Premises Identification Number (PID)

Assurance System Producer Program- Dairy

50% funding to a maximum of \$15,000

Purpose: Improve biosecurity, animal welfare

Requirements: (in addition to basic eligibility)

- ProAction registered;
- Veterinarian assessment /completion of Biosecurity/Animal
 Welfare Equipment Recommendation Report BEFORE
 PURCHASES ARE MADE

Eligible Equipment/Improvements:

 Colostrum batch pasteurizer, foot baths, slip prevention in walkways, loading chute, tilt table/trimming chute, rubberized flooring, improved stall comfort, motorized cow brushes, calving cameras, group feeding systems for delivery of milk to calves

Farm and Ranch Water Infrastructure Program (FRWIP)

Dugout, Pipeline, and Well Rebate

Farm Stewardship Program

ВМР	Goal	
Permanent Tame Forage	Increased seeded acres of marginal land/saline soils and reduce GHG emissions	
Permanent Native Forage	Assist producers to seeding native forage	
Native Rangeland Grazing Management	To improve the health and productivity of existing native rangelands	
Riparian Grazing Management	Protect water quality and improve riparian area health	
Invasive Plant Biocontrol and Targeted Grazing	Address large areas of invasive species with non- herbicide options	
Variable Rate Mapping (***REBATE***)	Increase uptake of precision agriculture and reduce GHG emissions	
Livestock Operations Suite	Protect surface water and groundwater resources by mitigating environmental impacts of operations	
Drainage Stewardship	Mitigate impacts of improper drainage and increase number of permitted quarters	
Multi Producer Water Management	Assist producers working as a group to reduce impacts of drainage on downstream stakeholders	
Environmental Solutions	Implement innovative and non-typical solutions to mitigate environmental risk from agricultural operations.	

Livestock Stewardship BMPs

Purpose: to protect and improve surface water and groundwater resources by mitigating environmental impacts from livestock.

- Improve Run-off Control
- Enhance ManureStorage

- Plan for Nutrient Management







Irrigation Program

- Irrigation Development Program
 - Secure water supply to the edge of an irrigable parcel (min 10 acres)
 - 67% of eligible costs up to \$300,000 per applicant; or \$1320 per new acre
- Irrigation Environmental Efficiency Program
 - Low efficiency or high pressure systems high efficiency, low pressure systems
 - 30% of eligible costs to max \$50,000 per applicant.

Agriculture Skills and Knowledge (ASK)

50% funding Training Only

Rebate

- 50% of eligible costs to a maximum rebate of \$10,000 per eligible applicant over the CAP term
- Maximum rebate of \$2,500 per applicant per year
- Approved course list on website
- Employees of an eligible applicant
- Min rebate of \$250



Agriculture Awareness Initiative Program (AAIP)

50% funding

- Industry targeted
 - Education and training to engage producers in awareness efforts
- Youth/consumer targeted
 - Development and delivery of tools, resources, programming and communication materials to enhance consumer and youth understanding of, and trust in, modern agriculture.
